

## CORONAVIRUS CATCH UP PREMIUM 2020 - 2021

MONEY ALLOCATED FROM CENTRAL GOVERNMENT	3 tranches of £8140, paid into school termly
RATIONALE	<ul> <li>We have decided to allocate Coronavirus catch Up Grant where the need is greatest.</li> <li>We have a proven record of pupils making excellent progress in school and we have identified areas where pupils have the shortest amount of time to catch up.</li> <li>On return to school in September 2020 baseline teacher assessments were completed to ascertain the learning gaps resulting from lock down/school closure from March 2020.</li> <li>DFE Catch up premium has been allocated to areas where pupils have the widest gaps with their age related expectations for learning.</li> <li>Allocation was also determined for those pupils who have the shortest amount of time left before they are expected to be secondary ready.</li> </ul>
SPENDING	<ul> <li>1.5 FTE additionalTeaching Assistants have been recruited at a cost of £12,736 per term.</li> <li>National Tutoring Programme at a cost of £2400.</li> </ul>
ACTIONS	<ul> <li>Additional 1.5 FTE Teaching Assistants allocated into the Y6 cohort. This gives a 1:9 adult to child ratio.</li> <li>TAs to provide small group intensive support within class time and additional master classes catch up time in addition to teaching time.</li> <li>Booster and homework sessions will run after school once a week.</li> <li>6-8 children identified will receive curriculum support through The Thrive Approach in order that their academic and complex social and emotional needs are met.</li> <li>National Tutoring Programme for 48 pupils in Years 2, 3, 4 and 5.</li> </ul>
IMPACT MEASURES	<ul> <li>It is expected that pupils will make accelerated progress over time in order to close learning gaps. This will allow pupil attainment to recover and reach national expectations by the end of the academic year.</li> <li>Attainment and achievement measures will be collated on an at least termly basis in the following areas: <ul> <li>Reading</li> <li>Accelerated Reading</li> <li>Writing</li> <li>Maths</li> <li>Multiplication Tables</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
SCHOOL FUNDED CATCH UP	<ul> <li>School Improvement Plan 2020-2021 has outlined actions for every year group in order to catch up with their learning.</li> <li>Maps of Attainment for each year group, for each term, have been created outlining learning outcomes missed and when they will be caught up.</li> <li>Map of Attainment catch up grids will be used diagnostically to enable teachers to construct their teaching and learning plans.</li> <li>An impact measure grid is created against each learning outcome to illustrate</li> </ul>

	<ul><li>pupil catch up.</li><li>Impact measures will be shared with governors termly.</li></ul>
IMPACT	<ul> <li>Coronavirus catch up premium has had an exceptional positive impact on outcomes for attainment and pastoral care.</li> <li>Interventions were delivered for all groups of pupils and most pupils made accelerated progress.</li> <li>The school delivered provision map costed provision for 327 pupil intervention opportunities, at a total cost of £86,305 ( not including Education, Health and Care Plans and Early T=Years Inclusion Fund support.</li> <li>This included additional provision map costed provision for 98 pupils intervention opportunities, with an average outcome of +0.15 (above average) and a cost of £17,236.</li> <li>The National Tutoring Programme was very effective with an outcome of +0.31, which is above the expected average outcome.</li> <li>The school has also delivered same day masterclass interventions which were not costed, but had a positive outcome on attainment and progress. This will ensure a sustained catch up for pupils.</li> </ul>
