If you are being bullied:

DO...

- Use eye contact and tell them to STOP.
- Ignore them.
- Walk away.
- Tell someone.
- Remember it is not your fault and you are NOT alone.

DON'T...

- Do what they say.
- Hit them.
- Say mean things back.
- Try to hurt their feelings.



What should I do if I see someone being bullied?

- Tell someone
- Tell the bully to STOP

What will the adults in school do?

Incidents of possible bullying will be reported to the victim's class teacher, who will investigate the incident, set consequences for the perpetrator before informing the headteacher, leadership team or safeguarding leads.

The perpetrator will be helped to understand the consequences of their actions and warned that there must be no further incidents. Parents are informed of bullying incidents and what action is being taken.
