This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Music is taught in class every week and is informed by the model music curriculum (March 2021). Lessons are a minimum of 40 minutes and are taught by class teachers or a music specialist. Teaching is supported by specialist planning and the Charanga curriculum scheme of work in key stages 1 and 2. This musical learning is further supported by weekly singing assemblies in each year group, lasting 20 minutes.

In EYFS, Nursery children are taught music through stories and nursery rhymes. They have a variety of instruments to make music themselves during short music lessons. Reception follow the Sing Up scheme.

Children in years 3-5 learn an instrument as a whole class taught by a music specialist from North Tyneside Music Hub. They have this tutoring for one term and learn to play and perform songs and pieces together.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

At Denbigh Community Primary School, we have a Key Stage 2 choir who meet weekly. This is funded by school and open to all children in Key Stage 2.

There is a weekly dance club for Key Stage 1 children where the children are exposed to a wide range of music.

We offer small group instrument lessons in Rocksteady. This is funded by parents however there are two free places for Pupil Premium children.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Children will have the opportunity to perform or experience high quality music this academic year. Please see below for a list of those opportunities:

- Choir performing for the Stroke North East charity at Christmas
